List EVERY thing each jurisdiction can or cannot do. Keep those pages as you will use them for future assignments as well.

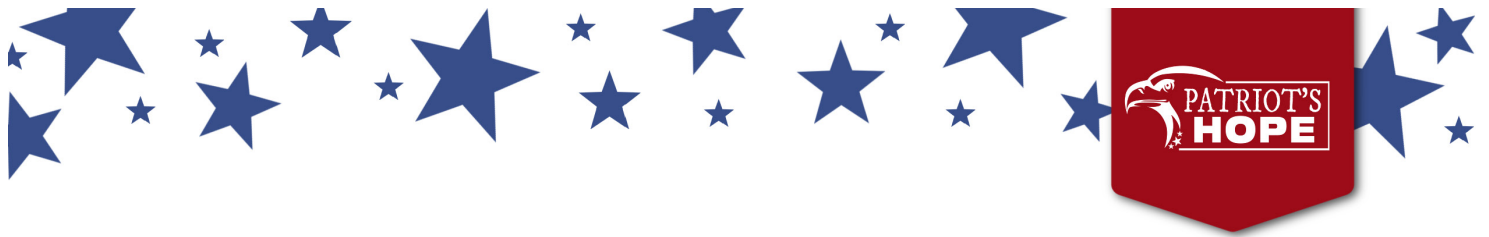
